

Owning a Dog in Cary: Everything You Need to Know

4 Types of Laws to Abide When Owning a Dog in Cary

1. Leash Laws

The city of Cary requires that all pets be on a leash or lead if they're not on their owner's property. Dogs are only allowed off-leash in community areas when located within the town's designated dog parks.

If these rules are not followed, owners can face a charge of \$20 for the first offense and additional penalties for repeat offenses.

2. Pooper Scooper Laws

In Cary, owners are required to pick up their pets' feces whether on public or private property. Those who experience repeat issues with undisposed feces and know the pet and owner can contact a Cary animal services officer to resolve the issue.

3. Required Vaccinations

The only required dog vaccination by law in Cary, North Carolina is the rabies vaccine, and puppies typically receive their first dose at 16 weeks of age, and no earlier than 15 weeks. The vaccine is good for up to one year, so after that, dogs will need to receive another dose, which is then good for three years.

Along with the required rabies vaccine, some recommended vaccinations for your pet include the following:

- Distemper/parvovirus (DHPP)
- Leptospirosis
- Bordetella
- Lyme disease
- Canine influenza
- And more

4. Dog Bite Laws

When someone is bitten by a domesticated animal, it's mandated by North Carolina law to report the case to the police department. Once reported, the pet's owner will

be required to show proof of the rabies vaccination, and the pet in question needs to undergo a 10-day observation period. Depending on the case at hand, the animal may also be required to be observed at the Wake County Animal Shelter's veterinary hospital at the owner's expense.

One of the best ways to prevent dog bites is to obey the leash law, which ensures the safety of your animal, as well as those in your general vicinity.

Additional Tips on Dog Ownership in Cary

Seasons to Watch Out for Coyotes

The spring and fall are when you need to be the most careful and watchful for coyotes. The springtime, which can be considered anywhere between February and May, is the most notable season for coyotes to be active in public, as they are mainly focused on breeding and raising their young.

Additionally, there is an increased rate of coyote sightings between October and November. This is because young coyotes are now leaving their parents' territory, traveling longer distances, and establishing territories of their own.

Recommendations for Navigating Hot Climates

Due to the hot and humid climate during the summer months in and around Cary, you'll want to ensure that your furry friend is protected from potential health risks, such as heat exhaustion, burns, and more. Because of this, some of the things that our team recommends include:

- Making sure your pet always has access to fresh, cold water
- Providing ample shade when your dog is outside

- Scheduling walks and playtime during cooler mornings or evenings

Fence Specifications for Your Home

Fences must be installed entirely on your property and not on easements or other restricted areas. Though most residential fences do not require a permit, one is necessary for fences taller than eight feet, as well as those adjacent to a thoroughfare or collector road.

More specifically, dog fences must be at least 100 square feet for pets that are under 20 pounds and no less than 200 square feet for dogs that are 20 pounds or more. These measurements allow pets to have plenty of space to play and explore, increasing their quality of life.
